## Australasian Medical Services Coalition Ltd (AMSC) Official Launch 30 January 2021



The Australasian Medical Services Coalition Ltd (AMSC) held its official launch at the Primus Hotel Sydney on Saturday 30 January 2021. This inaugural event marked the birth of a non-profit organisation that sets forth unprecedented representation of all health professionals within one single entity in Australasia. AMSC values inclusivity for all members of the community, equity of access to healthcare, empowerment of disadvantaged groups, collaboration within the health community and sustainability of impact. The interdisciplinary approach required to manage the COVID-19 pandemic highlights the need for enhanced inter-disciplinary communication and professional support. AMSC fosters an open platform for all health professionals to brainstorm solutions in a global health "think tank", and liaises between medical, health, government and community entities to rise up to the challenges of any potential health problem that may arise, the most current of which being the COVID-19 pandemic that has shaken the global medical landscape to the core.

The launch opened with a speech by AMSC President Dr Xiufang Vivian Liu with the acknowledgement of country and a warm welcome to all the guests, VIPs, members and sponsors. Dr Liu recounted the thought process involved in the founding of AMSC, emphasising the importance of working hand-in-hand as health professionals in a collaborative partnership, "coordination of continual medical education and community resources" in order to "create and strengthen institutional and industrial partnerships, as well as to ensure patient safety". AMSC aims to elevate Australian healthcare to the next level.

Guest-of-Honour Ms Lisa Woodland, Director of NSW Multicultural Health Communication Service, extended her congratulations for the founding of AMSC and was invited to present A/Professor Seng Chai Chua with the Certificate of Appointment as the Chairperson of the Board of Directors for AMSC.

As Chair of the AMSC Board, A/Prof Chua proceeded to present Certificates of Appointment to the eight (8) AMSC Board of Directors and the AMSC Honorary Consultant: 1.
